- 2. What are the difficulties Sankhya faces in explaining evolution through Prakrti and Purusa which are intrinsically different in nature? Discuss.
- 3. Discuss Buddhism as an ethical practice by analyzing the cause of suffering (theory of dependent origination) and cessation of suffering by a noble path.
- 4. Considering a situation of ethical dilemma, critically analyze the role of deontological and utilitarian theories in ethical decision making.
- 5. Discuss and explain the complementing nature of Anekantavada and Syadvada as theories of reality and knowledge in Jainism.
- 6. "Identity is always qualified by difference" & "Knowledge always points to an object which exists really and outside of it". In the light of these statements, analyze Ramanuja's criticisms against Shankara's theory advaitavada.
- 7. Explain the categories of 'Action'(karma) and 'Non-existence'(Abhava). What is the need of these categories in Vaishesika? Discuss.
- 8. Taking Locke's view of 'tabula rasa' and Berkeley's view 'to be is to be perceived', explain the nature of knowledge.

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
